

- Will spend the academic year researching her new novel, "The Dream Hotel"







Of that 97% is Salaries and Benefits.


- Faculty/Other Academic Salaries 43%

Personnel FTE






CHASS STUDENT 3QA* COLLEGE ENROLLMENT AND REVENUE
