





DEPARTMENT OF HISTORY RETENTION AND GRADUATION RATES








Entering Cohort Graduation (Finished Any Program at UCR) Frosh Graduation



- Monetary awards and shoutouts in research impact marketing and communications.



INLAND EMPIRE LABOR & COMMUNITY CENTER




- Addresses critical issues facing working people and their communities in the Inland Empire and California.








FY25 CHASS BUDGET

Revenue for 2024-25


By funding source – all funds
